CITY LOOP DRIVE Begin at the corner of Stevens and Riverside and follow the City Drive signs to these points of interest. A. Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist; B. Manito Park and Japanese Gardens; C. Manito Golf and Country Club; D. Cheney Cowles Memorial Museum; E. High Bridge Park; F. Finch Arboretum; G. Riverside State Park; H. Spokane Falls from the Monroe Street Bridge; I. Museum of American Native Cultures.

TURNBULL NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE 1-235-4723, South of Cheney on Badger Lake Rd. A 17,000 acre reluge for migratory waterfowl is a photographers delight, with many observation blinds. Walk or drive through several loop trails.

ST. JOHN'S CATHEDRAL 838-4277, E. 127 12th. A classic, English-gothic cathedral built in 1927. Free tours on Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday, and Sunday.

WALK IN THE WILD ZOO E. 12600 Euclid, 924-7221. This 240 acresite is home to many species of North American wildlife.

GRAND COULEE DAM Located west of Spokane approximately 82 miles is Grand Coulee Dam. The Dam is reached via U.S. 2 and S.R. 174. Grand Coulee Dam's construction in the 1930's created Franklin D. Roosevelt Lake which is 151 miles long and stretches to the Canadian border. It is possible to boat into Canada from Grand Coulee. Maps are available from the U.S. Park service that give detailed information on the lake.
