March 2-5, 2003

Welcome to the web site for the 2003 AJCU-CITM annual meeting to be held at Instituto Tecnológico y de Estudios Superiores de Occidente (ITESO), in Guadalajara, México.

We will be getting together with some of our colleagues in information technology from the Jesuit colleges and universities in México, Central America and Latin America, as represented through the Asociación de Universidades Confiades a la Compañía de Jesús en América Latina (AUSJAL).

Since 1990, there has been at least one representative from an AUSJAL school attending the annual AJCU-CITM meetings -- with Juan Lanzagorta from ITESO being a frequent participant since 1995. In 1995, we met with our colleagues from AUSJAL schools Universidad Iberoamericana in México City.

Working with the model at our annual meeting at Loyola Marymount University in 2001, our meeting will be followed by a joint meeting of the JesuitNET Steering Board and the AJCU Deans of Adult and Continuing Education (DACE), along with colleagues from AUSJAL. This JesuitNET-DACE-AUSJAL meeting will take place from the afternoon of March 5th through March 7th.

Our meeting will begin with a reception on the evening of Sunday, March 2nd and conclude with lunch on Wednesday, March 5th. Upon the conclusion of the AJCU-CITM meeting, several of us will be staying on to attend the JesuitNET-DACE-AUSJAL meeting.

We will hold all our meetings at ITESO, one of six Jesuit institutions of higher education in México.

Our host, Juan Lanzagorta, from ITESO, has been working on setting up the logistics for both meetings.

Hotel Accommodations

Juan has made arrangements with the Crowne Plaza Guadalajara to have set aside a block of rooms for attendees for both meetings. Room rates will be around 1,143 pesos for a single (1,251 pesos for a double) which includes 15% for IVA (value-added tax). Room rate covers daily breakfast buffet.

Money Issues

Presently, the currency exchange rate for the Mexican peso is that one US dollar can buy about ten Mexican pesos. The Mexican peso fluctuates daily (but it rarely fluctuates no more than 10 Mexican for one US dollar) so it is good idea to watch the foreign money exchange rates, from time to time. We should be able to exchange currency at the hotel and local banks. However, you will get better rates of exchange at the airport when you arrive in Guadalajara.

Mexican paper currency comes in several denominations and colors. Denominations for paper currency are 20, 50, 100, 200 and 500. Coins come in 5, 10, 20 and 50 centavos, 1, 2, 5, 10 and 20 pesos.

Be prepared for IVA! IVA is the value-added tax similar to our sales tax. The IVA rate is a hefty 15%.

In Guadalajara, hotels, restaurants, many stores, and travel agencies will accept credit cards. You may want to keep on hand US one-dollar bills. They will come in handy for tipping.

Getting to Guadalajara

Guadalajara, the third largest city in México, is easy to get to by airplane. Airlines that fly to Aeropuerto Internacional "Miguel Hidalgo" (GDL), Guadalajara's airport, include American, ATA, Continental, Delta, Mexicana and United. There are direct non-stop flights from Atlanta, Chicago, Dallas, Houston, Los Angeles and Miami. For more information about the airport, check out Judy King's article, Arrivol at Guadalmara Arrivol. México's Entry Requirements

As a US citizen, to enter México you need to obtain (provided by your airline) a *Tourist Card* (FMT). To get your Tourist Card you will need to prove citizenship, a passport is best for this purpose.

Airlines will furnish the Tourist Card. Be sure to save the copy that is returned to you, upon entry, as you must present this copy when leaving México.

Guadalajara, México March 5-7, 2003 (Revised Nov. 20, 2002)

The JesuitNET and Deans of Adult and Continuing Education (DACE) representatives approved respective motions to hold the proposed spring 2003 JesuitNET-DACE-AUSJAL Conference at the Instituto Tecnológico y de Estudios Superiores de Occidente (ITESO) in Guadalajara, México on March 5-7, 2003 immediately following the AJCU Conference for Information Technologies Management (CITM) meeting being held at ITESO on March 2-5.

The basic purpose of the conference will be to

- 1. familiarize AJCU and AUSJAL participants with what their schools are doing in distance learning and adult education,

Conference Hotel

The Crowne Plaza Guadalajara will be our conference hotel. A block of rooms have been set aside for participants for both meetings, from February 28, 2003 through March 7, 2003. If you are planning to stay the weekend after the JesuitNET-DACE-AUSJAL you should not have any trouble to extend registrations through that weekend (and then some). We can certainly begin making reservations now.

Now for the details:

- Use the Holiday Inn Reservation System calling 1-800-Holiday (1-800-465-4329)
- Group code is ACJ
- The cost is \$125 UDS for single or double occupancy, one king bed. Rate includes buffet breakfast and taxes (IVA 15%). Please ask for single or double occupancy at the time you make the reservation. In the Holiday Inn Reservation System, this rate is listed for "one king-size bed." The reservation system cannot handle requests for two beds in the room but not to worry. This can be arranged later.
- Rates will be guaranteed through January 31, 2003.
- Dates available for checking in are from February 28, 2003 through March 7, 2003. If someone is planning to arrive earlier then we will work with the hotel to make this accommodation.

Now, for the details about the Holiday Inn Reservation System -because of a technical limitation on the reservation system if you ask for reservations for Crowne Plaza Guadalajara you will get only one option: \$125 USD, single or double occupancy in a room with one king bed.

But you will be charged the actual rate of 1,143 Mexican pesos per night (about \$110.00 USD depending upon the currency exchange rate) for single occupancy and 1,251 Mexican Pesos for double occupancy.

Single occupancy includes one full buffer breakfast while double occupancy rates includes two full buffet breakfasts.

If you do need two beds in the room then please specify that on the conference registration form and we will make the arrangements with the hotel for you to have two beds.
