Podcasting for Learning: Some Successes and Challenges

Changing the Face of Blackboard

Frequently when one explores a Blackboard course one gets lost in a flood of folders and documents. This very vertical display of information makes it difficult for students to navigate through the course and find information. At Saint Joseph's University, we have been introducing online faculty members to the "Learning Unit" tool in Blackboard. This tool enables one to deliver information in Blackboard in a horizontal manner.

Saint Joseph's University has also added blogs, wikis, and podcasts to Blackboard through the use of a building block. We will demonstrate how these new tools are working in Blackboard and describe how the faculty is implementing them.

Wiki Redux or Vicki's Wikis: Using Wikis for Personal, Professional, and Collaborative Administrative Projects

Last year's conference presentation on wikis inspired me to experiment with pbwiki.com. Within a month, I created nine free wikis for various projects, both in my department and for a California academic library association. The "sketch book" qualities of the wiki are ideal for developing and polishing drafts of work, whether shared or personal. In August, USF regional campus librarians adopted the collaborative potential of the wiki for collection development decisions, online circulation standards, and personnel policies.

The Impact of Classroom Activities via Video on Distance Student Learning

This presentation will describe the model and tools used to successfully add video lecture components to courses with minimal faculty and staff time. Assessment data examining the impact on distant student learning will be discussed. The presentation is based on data collected from students enrolled in Creighton University's distance doctor of pharmacy program. Data was collected in the form of narrative student comments and grade comparisons between courses in fall 2005 and the same courses with the same instructors in fall 2006. The data clearly indicates the availability of classroom activities via rich media files had a positive impact on student learning and engagement.

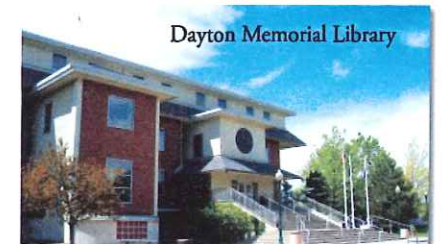
