#### **Basic Vocabulary**

Twitterer, Tweep or Tweeple: Twitter users Follower: Twitter user who tracks your tweets RT (ReTweet): resending another's tweet

DM (Direct Message): a tweet that is only visible by the recipient

@reply: sent to a specific user but visible to all

#: hash mark that designates a topic that can be followed

- Help and retweet others
- Humor and snark in moderation
- Listen and engage in conversation
- Don't spam or over promote
- Pause between tweets
- Use hashtags
- Avoid automated tweets
- Don't blast others
