Which Law Schools Have Offerings in Education Law?

The attached article provides the results of a recent survey of AALS-member law schools as to their extent of offerings, including courses, clinics, and other activities in education law in comparison to a similar survey in 2004. The results showed a notable increase for course offerings in general education law, but not in special education law or higher education law as compared with the 2004 survey. The various other offerings were at a limited level and varied widely among the law schools.

Based on applying a point-system for the results reported in the article, I find that the following law schools appear to offer the largest concentration of education law offerings:

- 1. Loyola University Chicago School of Law
- 2. Harvard Law School
- 3. NYU School of Law
- 4. Stanford Law School
- 5. Boston College Law School

However, based on the stated limitations of the survey and the subjectivity in formulating and applying any such point system, interested students should verify and supplement these ratings for goodness of fit with their particular qualifications and interests.
