He has held fellowships from the National Science Foundation, Mellon Foundation, and National Endowment for the Humanities. Prof. Trout works at the borders of philosophy of science, epistemology, and psychology, with occasional forays into public policy. His most recent book is *The Empathy Gap: Building Bridges to the Good Life and the Good Society* (Viking/Penguin, 2009).
